“India's History – Delhi Sultanate”

The Delhi Sultanate was principal Muslim kingdom based mostly in Delhi, that stretched over large parts of the Indian subcontinent for 320 years. Five dynasties ruled over Delhi Sultanate from 1206 to 1526

Mamluk (Slave) Dynasty: Qutb-ud-din Aibak was the first Sultan of Delhi and his dynasty conquered large areas of northern India. Aibak reigned as the Sultan of Delhi for 4 years. During this period, many nobles of Afghan and Persia migrated and settled in India. After Aibak died, Aram Shah assumed power in 1210, but he was assassinated in 1211 by Iltutmish, his nephew. Iltutmish conquered Multan and Bengal from contesting Muslim rulers, as well as Ranathambhore and Siwalik from the Hindu rulers. Iltutmish's rule lasted till 1236.

Khilji Dynasty: The first ruler of the dynasty was Jalal-ud-din Firoz Shah Khilji. He came to power in 1290 after killing the last ruler of the Mamluk dynasty. He was of Turko-Afghan origin, and ruled for 6 years before he was murdered in 1296 by his nephew Juna Khan (Ala al-din Khilji). He conquered Gujarat, Ranthambor, Chitor and Malwa. Ala-ud-din's died in 1316.

rechristened himself as Ghiyas-ud-din Tughlaq (Tughlak Shah). He was of Turko-Indian origins. He ruled for 5 years. According to some historians he was killed by his son Muhammad bin Tughlaq, who then assumed power in 1325 and ruled for 26 years. During his rule, Delhi Sultanate reached its peak in terms of geographical reach, covering most of the Indian subcontinent. Muhammad bin Tughlaq died in 1351. He was succeeded by Firoz Shah Tughlaq.

Sayyid Dynasty: The Sayyid dynasty was a Turkic dynasty, which ruled Delhi Sultanate from 1415 to 1451. Little is known about the rule by Sayyid dynasty. According to historian, the Delhi Sultanate had an effective control of only a few miles around Delhi. Sayyid Khizr Khan was the first ruler of the dynasty. The Sayyid dynasty was displaced by the Lodi dynasty in 1451.

Lodi Dynasty: The Lodi dynasty had its origins in the Afghan Lodi tribe. Bahlol Lodi (or Bahlul Lodi) was the first Afghan to rule Delhi Sultanate. After Bahlol Lodi died, his son Sikandar Shah Ghazi Lodi ruled from 1489-1517. After Sikandar Lodi died in 1517, his second son Ibrahim Lodi assumed power. In 1526, Mughal king Babur came and defeated and killed Ibrahim Lodi, during Battle of Panipat. Ibrahim Lodi's death ended the Delhi Sultanate, and Mughal Empire replaced it.

Delhi Sultanate marked an era of temple destruction and desecration. The Sultans of Delhi Sultanate in some cases had forbidden reconstruction of damaged Hindu, Jain and Buddhist temples, as well as prohibited repairs of old temples or construction of any new temples.
